Management has a duty to provide and maintain, so far as is reasonably practicable, a working environment that is safe and without risks to health and will:

- Fulfill its responsibility under the OH&S Act and Regulations and take practical steps to provide and maintain a safe and healthy work environment for all employees and contractors
- Undertake regular assessments of OH&S and consult with employees and contractors on all OHS matters
- Provide applicable information, instruction, training, measurable targets and supervision to all employees
- Ensure that policies are periodically reviewed and that they remain consistent with current legislation and company health and safety objectives
- 2 Ensure continuous improvement in OHS management systems, policies, procedures and practices.

Employees and contractors have a duty to take reasonable care for their own health and safety and of others affected by their actions at work and must:

- At all times comply with and maintain all safety procedures and directives as agreed to between management and employees
- Ensure that all items and facilities that are provided in the interest of health and safety are correctly used and not interfered with or misused
- Report all incidents, near misses and accidents to their supervisor and complete necessary forms.
